Compass Housing Alliance (CHA), in coordination with Luther Memorial Church, proposes to redevelop a church parking lot into a 3-story, 59-apartment permanent supportive housing community to serve formerly homeless and low income families and individuals in the Broadview neighborhood of northwest Seattle. CHA will provide integrated property management and supportive services on-site.

Compass Housing Alliance

Compass Housing Alliance provides a spectrum of housing and services for homeless and low income individuals and families throughout King County. Compass Housing provides day services, emergency shelter, transitional housing, Veterans housing, permanent supportive housing, permanent affordable housing and a family support program. Since 2010, Compass Housing has opened four new housing development projects, the Renton Veteran's Center, which provides housing for 58 formerly homeless families and individuals, Dekko Place, which provides 50 units of affordable housing in downtown Seattle for low-wage workers, Nyer Urness House which includes 80 units of supportive housing for chronically homeless individuals and Compass on Dexter, which provides 74 units for homeless and low income individuals and families.
